Shoeboxes

Operation Christmas Child



Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. Their mission is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ. These simple gifts are sent outside the United States to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to children living on Native

American reservations in the U.S. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has delivered gift-filled shoeboxes to over 146 million children in more than 100 countries.

Items to include in a Shoebox Empty shoeboxes are at church or use one you have.

A WOW item: Doll (Consider including accessories such as doll clothes or a small doll bed.) Soccer ball (Make sure to include a manual air pump so that the ball can be inflated.) Stuffed animal, An outfit of clothing to wear, Small musical instrument (such as a harmonica or woodwind recorder), Backpack

Personal Care items; Comb, Hairbrush, Toothbrush (but not toothpaste), Washcloth, Bar soap (packaged and/or in a container), Adhesive bandages (Do not include liquid antibiotic ointment.) Reusable plastic containers: cup, water bottle, plate, bowl, blunt-edged utensils, (Consider filling a container with non-liquid items such as hair bows, bracelets, sunglasses, or washcloths) Blanket, Non-liquid lip balm, Flashlight (solar-powered or hand-crank; Compact mirror

School Supplies: Pencils, Small manual pencil sharpener, Colored pencils, Pencil case, Pens, Crayons, Markers, Notebooks, Blank index cards, Solar-powered calculator, Scissors, Ruler, Protractor, Glue stick (do not include liquid glue), Small adhesive tape.

Clothing and Accessories: Shirts and pants, Pillowcase dress (loose-fitting sundress), Underwear, Shoes and socks, Flip-flops, Hat/scarf/mittens, Sunglasses, Tote bag/purse, Hair bows, Friendship bracelets (woven with yarn or embroidery thread).

Crafts and Activities: Coloring books, Watercolor set (non-liquid containers), paint brushes, canvas or paper, Puzzles, Playdough (Consider adding plastic cookie cutters as non-sharp utensils the child can use with the playdough.) Stickers, Chalkboard and chalk, Binoculars, Skipping rope/Jump rope, Make-it-yourself craft items or kit.

Toys: Foam ball, Kickball, Costume items to play dress-up, such as crowns and costume jewelry, Plastic toys and toy figures, Yo-yo, Small Frisbee, Small kite, Etch A Sketch, Tennis ball, Finger puppets, Slinky, Play cars/trucks/boats, Plastic tools, Plastic dinosaurs. No candy is allowed.

A Personal Note: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself, your family, or group. If you include your name and an address, the child may be able to write back. Be sure to pray for the child receiving the box as you pack it.

<u>\$ 9.00 Per box</u>: For shipping and handling. To track your box(es), you can go to "Follow my box" at <u>https://www.samaritanspurse.org/operation-christmas-child/follow-your-box/</u> to donate the \$9.00 and print a label for your box. You may also get a standard label at church for the box. Do not wrap the box.

Please return filled boxes to church by Sunday, Nov. 11, 2018.
