You know what I love about this passage from Isaiah? Isaiah reassures God's faithfulness to a devastated people. Israel have experienced the traumatic terror of a Babylonian invasion. Of course, the critic in me wants to say, "Hey, God. Hurry up! What's taking so long? You started this whole earth thing waaaaaaaay before Isaiah's day and you are *still* not done yet?!"

But then I remember, it is a great thing that God is not done yet. Because that means we are all being invited into the *continued* work of creatING. Right now. We are invited to join with God in *continuing* to dream new words into being. New ways of worshipping. New ways of celebrating. New ways to be God's hands and feet in the world. We are invited to open our eyes and hearts and minds and spirits to see the new things God is doING right here and now. That's pretty great!

When we make space for newness, God does not disappoint. When we take time to reflect on the ways God is showing up in our lives, our cups are filled to overflowing with new life, new hope, new love. God is doING a new thing in our midst!

The Holy One dreamed new dreams into Isaiah's time, and continues to dream in us this day. May the Lord open our eyes to see the new Jerusalem that is bursting into being now and every moment. This season, let us open our spirits to allow space for all the creatING that God is still doing. Right here. Right now.

OUTREACH UPDATE –

Despite COVID, the Outreach Committee was able to "reach out" to several organizations as well as help several families in our community.

From our meager budget we have financially supported our missionary, Nan McCurty, our local ambulance and fire departments, REACH shelter, Valor Ministries, the Community Action Council, Habitat for Humanity, Katie's Cupboard and others. We also supported two local families who had house fires as well as several families in need who requested immediate assistance for provisions of food and other supplies.

In May, we provided a meal for the Hope Center in Hagerstown, whose mission is to provide shelter, food, summer camp, bible studies and other programs for those in need.

We have unfortunately had to cancel many activities this year. The Salvation Army bell ringing has been canceled; however, we will be having a fund drive for the SA in November. Please consider giving to this worthy cause. See additional information in this newsletter.

Katie's Cupboard – In addition to congregational donations, we were blessed with a small grant from the Baltimore-Washington Conference as well as a donation from the Boonsboro Lions Club. Thanks to Becky & Klaus Hein and Cathy Collins, we have been able to carry on with the distribution of food and household items on the 4th Tuesday of each month since March of this year. They have also agreed to continue to coordinate the purchase, packing up and distribution throughout the winter months. In November and December, we will be distributing the food on the 2nd Tuesday of the month in order to get Thanksgiving and Christmas items to the families in a timely manner. After the first of the year, we'll go back to the 4th Tuesday.

We could not have done any of these things without the support of our beloved Benevola. Please continue to pray for us as we go forth in an effort to reach out on behalf of God and His love for us. Samaritan's Purse Christmas Shoeboxes - due by Nov. 15. 2020

During this CRAZY year, there are many people around the world looking for comfort and peace. A simple yet powerful way to share hope in the Lord is to pack a shoebox for a child to be sent to places that even missionaries can't go. A story about one of the recipients is about a Philippine young lady named Analyn. She was raised in poverty and never got a Christmas gift until she got an Operation Christmas Child shoebox from her church. She opened it to find brightly colored crayons, a notebook, and a stuffed animal. She said, "My heart was jumping for joy!" She could hardly believe that it was real? She felt loved and later gave her heart to the Lord and began teaching others about Him.

When you pack shoeboxes with school supplies, toys, and other gifts, you help prepare the way for the people with Samaritan's Purse tell the children about God's greatest gift, Jesus Christ. Over 178 million shoebox gifts have been delivered in 170 countries and territories.

If you are uncomfortable shopping for gift items right now, you may want to build personalized shoeboxes online at **Samaritanspurse.org/occ**. Guidelines for filling the boxes are listed here below.

<u>Items to include in a Shoebox</u> Empty shoeboxes are at church or use one you have.

A WOW item: Doll, doll clothes or a small doll bed. Soccer ball (Make sure to include a manual air pump so that the ball can be inflated.) Stuffed animal, An outfit of clothing to wear, Small musical instrument (such as a harmonica or woodwind recorder), Backpack

Personal Care items; Comb, Hairbrush, Toothbrush (but not toothpaste), Washcloth, Bar soap (packaged or in a container), Adhesive bandages, cup, water bottle filled with such as hair bows, bracelets, sunglasses, or washcloths. Non-liquid lip balm, Flashlight (solar-powered or hand-crank), Compact mirror

School Supplies: Pencils, Small manual pencil sharpener, Colored pencils, Pencil case, Pens, Crayons, Markers, Notebooks, Blank index cards, Solar-powered calculator, Scissors, Ruler, Protractor, Glue stick (do not include liquid glue), Small adhesive tape.

Clothing and Accessories: Shirts and pants, Pillowcase dress (loose-fitting sundress), Underwear, Shoes and socks, Flip-flops, Hat/scarf/mittens, Sunglasses, Tote bag/purse, Hair bows, bracelets.

Crafts and Activities: Coloring books, Watercolor set (non-liquid containers), paint brushes & paper, Puzzles, Playdough (plastic cookie cutters as non-sharp utensils to use with the playdough.) Stickers, Chalkboard and chalk, Binoculars, Skipping rope/Jump rope, Make-it-yourself craft items or kit.

Toys: Foam ball, Kickball, Costume items to play dress-up, such as crowns and costume jewelry, Plastic toys and toy figures, Yo-yo, Small Frisbee, Small kite, Etch A Sketch, Tennis ball, Finger puppets, Slinky, Play cars/trucks/boats, Plastic tools, Plastic dinosaurs. No candy is allowed.

A Personal Note: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and an address, the child may be able to write back. Be sure to pray for the child receiving the box as you pack it.

\$ 9.00 Per box: For shipping and handling. To track your box(es), you can go to "Follow my box" at https://www.samaritanspurse.org/operation-christmas-child/follow-your-box/ to donate the \$9.00 and print a label for your box. Standard labels are at church for the box. **Do not wrap the box.**

Please return filled boxes to church by Sunday, Nov. 15, 2020.
