FROM THE PASTOR DESK ---Pastor Suzanne Jones

Don't I have the right to do what I want with what belongs to me? Or are you resentful because I'm generous?' —Matthew 20:15

Each Sunday for the last 2 months, my sermons have revolved around Jesus's teachings in Mattew's gospel, specifically his parables. Jesus loves a good parable, but sometimes they really irk me! I often find myself wishing they made a little more sense and Jesus would be more straight-forward. Perhaps his hope was that we didn't find comfort in easy answers, but instead found joy in questioning with curiosity.

For example, the parable of the vineyard workers is so common that it's beginning to ease its way into the "easy answer" category. Ask someone what the parable is about and they may say: it's about how God's forgiveness extends to everyone, whether they came to faith at the beginning of their life, or at the end. But, what if there's more?

Let's think about it more literally: if we were the vineyard worker who has labored all day long in the hot sun, who receives the same amount of pay as the worker who only labored for an hour, we would probably feel some resentment. Just as they do in the story!

The amount they receive is a day's wage: a darius. It was usually enough to feed a family for a few days and was understood as a fair and good wage. That is why, when it was offered to the laborer early in the morning, they agreed to it. It was *enough*.

The vineyard owner challenges the laborer: why are you resentful? Why are you mad that they also received enough to feed their families?

In the Kingdom of God, it's not about getting what we *deserve*. It's about making sure everyone has *enough* - that *everyone* 's needs are met and cared for.

This parable isn't just about God's grace and mercy. It is also about a God of justice: a God who cares that the Kingdom on earth reflect the Kingdom of Heaven, where everyone has enough food, enough water, enough resources to live an abundant life.

As we enter these winter months, my prayer is that we, as individuals and as a church, will do our part to find ways in which we can be helpers in providing enough to make sure that needs are cared for.

Mammon Minute


